To perform correctly the horse needs to be supple obedient and precise.

For this, the rider needs to train gradually by using lateral work and correct training; he will then develop his muscle tone and also his mind.

This will enable horse and rider working in the correct outline, to perform all the movements required for Working Equitation. Working in harmony and empathy with his rider without force or harshness.

CCWE is holding a WE competition on 27th October 2012 at Morisset Showground NSW.

The field will have a 60 x 20m dressage arena, a warm up track, an obstacles warm up area and plenty of room to watch and cheer others as they compete.

We will have digital time keeping and extra judges in order to speed up the process between competitors

There will be training days during September/October. The locations will be Steve Jefferys place at Jilliby, ARC when it is allowed and Mick & Michelle will have WE training days on offer soon as well. Sandy Jeffery's may also be able to assist with riding and dressage lessons. The dressage tests will be available by the end of August for everyone to start practicing. I will provide some dates next week.

Please take note: Lame, ill or injured horses will not be able to enter. It will be a requirement that the organizers have had opportunity to assess the ability of your horse to approve your entry. It will be preferred if previous attendance to training sessions or competition (dressage or working equitation) to qualify to enter the CCWE competition.

This is due to safety and time efficiency issues during the competition.

The competition is divided into 3 sections, designed to test horse and rider, through a range of activities combining flat work (Dressage) movements, and obstacle tests, requiring horse and rider, to negotiate a number of obstacles similar to those encountered whilst working in the fields.

This competition aims to promote good horsemanship and a level of submission and control of the horse. It is great fun for horse and rider to participate; Spectators also enjoy this exciting discipline.

Our aim is to prepare not only for individual competitors, but also teams of 4 riders to compete against each other at venues in the future.
